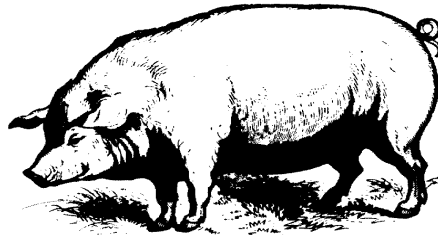

REQUEST FOR PARTICIPATION IN A BOOK ABOUT THE HISTORY OF THE CATHOLIC KOLPING SOCIETY OF CINCINNATI

To all Kolping members from Mike and Nancy Pelzel,

On November 26, 2014, the Catholic Kolping Society of Cincinnati will have been in existence for ninety years! That is a long history, one that needs to be remembered for the next ninety years and beyond.

Because of our experience in writing many family history books and through the encouragement of numerous Kolping members, we have agreed wholeheartedly to take on the responsibility of compiling the history of the Society. We will be relying heavily on the numerous long-time members and their families, as well as more recent members, to help us narrate this rich history.

In the last month or so, we have been assisted by long time members, Ted and Mary Tegenkamp, as well as Harry Talkers. They have supplied us with many of their own records and directed us to the location of whatever historical documents are stored at the Kolping Center. These records, dating to the 1920s and beyond, are invaluable. We suspect that there is a wealth of long lost additional information stored in the filing cabinets, boxes and photo albums of members' houses. Finding these dispersed records will be the task of many members.

Aside from a general history of the organization, some specific things need to be included in the pages.

1. The history of each sub group, those that exist today, as well as those groups that are now part of the Society's history.

2. Photographs and documents that capture moments in time during the last ninety years.
3. We hope that any member, especially those who have been around since the 1950s, can relate their experiences of being members of our Society. What has being a member of Kolping meant to you? How has your membership changed your life? These life stories are the true fabric of any history and are the life blood that has allowed the Kolping Society to prosper for all these years.
4. We expect that there are many children and grandchildren of deceased members who may still be able to locate pictures, documents, etc. that can help make clear the times before the 1950s.
5. We have located meeting minutes from the 1930s through the 1970s, though there are many years missing. Perhaps these records still exist in the homes of former recording secretaries.
6. Pictures of Kings and Queens from the long history of the Schützen Club and Schützenfest.
7. Other memorabilia from Kolping that has been collected over the years.

If any members have ideas on additional information that should be included, we are most interested in hearing your ideas. We will be happy to come to your house to collect any information you may have for inclusion in the book. We will scan the items and promptly return them to you.
