Care2Share 20th Anniversary

2019 celebrates the 20th anniversary of Care2Share. As November is the month of thanksgiving, we would like to share a bit about our organization, its accomplishments and appreciation with the Kolping Cincinnati Society. It is quite remarkable that a charitable nonprofit organization based strictly on volunteerism arrived at this milestone. But of course, we could not have made it without the contributions and support from the Kolping Society throughout as many years.

Care2Share humbly began when Chien and Thuy Vu (Kolping members for 16 years) and Hung and Hanna Pham came back to Vietnam in 1999 for the first time after fleeing communism in 1975 after the war. The level of poverty in their birth country moved them to form a nonprofit charitable organization to make annual missions for the past 20 years. A group of 10-20 Vietnamese including doctors, nurses, and dentists offer free medical and dental services, scholarships, bikes, construction of child care centers, drinking water systems, houses, and other projects during these charity missions. Care2Share operates entirely on volunteerism, with all travel expenses completely out of pocket. We now have a network of volunteers in various states, with one sister organization named Care2Share of The Carolinas.

To fund nearly two million dollars' worth of projects to date, Care2Share seeks contributions from individuals, corporations, businesses, and through fundraisers in multiple states, but mainly in Cincinnati. We are tremendously indebted to the Cincinnati Kolping Society for its donation of the halls and facilities for our annual fundraisers for most of our existence. We hereby express our sincere gratitude to Kolping Cincinnati for its generous contributions and spiritual support of Care2Share throughout the years. Most importantly, we are honored to join hands with Kolping Cincinnati in carrying out Blessed Adolf Kolping's spirit of charity.

In the spirit of thankfulness, we would like to invite as many Kolping members as possible to attend and celebrate our 20th annual event on November 9th, starting 7pm at the Kolping Center. A Vietnamese dinner will be served, followed by our celebration activities. We hope to see as many Kolping members present as possible. Fr. David Hiller Fund High School Scholarship

Once again, the Father David Hiller Fund will offer two (2) \$3000 grants for children of **active** Kolping parents. At least one parent must be a member for at least three years. Thank you for the many donations that you have provided to the Father David Hiller Fund. The donations are nearly 100% used for charity. No one on the Board receives any compensation and our only expenses are for envelopes, stamps and license fees. The only administrative costs are those to the Cincinnati Scholarship Foundation to vet the students for the FDHF Scholarships and to provide the checks to the high schools while being compliant with all the school's rules for donations to students. All donation checks by default must be deposited in the checking account. All bar tips, etc. are first given to the Kolping treasurer and then sent to the FDHF fund. 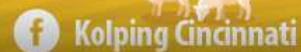
