Note from Fr. Dan

In November we celebrate two days that are related. One is All Saints Day, the other is All Souls Day. These two days connect us to the saints and the sinners who have gone before us from this world.

All Saints commemorates saintly folks who have gone before us but who are not canonized. I think of people who have made many contributions to my life and to the church. Who would they be? I think of my own mother who made so many sacrifices to raise me and my brothers and sisters. Mom had thirteen children, three of whom died in infancy and ten who reached adulthood. I am the youngest of the whole family. I think of my father, who loved life and loved us kids. He taught so much just by his example.

I think of how our family sat together for Sunday Mass, how we all had our household chores, and how we grew in the faith of our parents. My father passed away of a heart attack, when I was in fourth grade. Mom passed away just before her 95th birthday. Mom and Dad were good, holy people. Same for my deceased sisters and brothers. I think of them as we come to the Memorial Mass on October 27.

As a Kolping family, we will remember those who have passed away this year. It is always inspiring to remember what our deceased loved ones gave to us—life, nurturing, faith. I always love to celebrate All Saints and All Souls days. These feasts remind us that we are all called to be good disciples of the Lord, good Catholics in every sense of the word. But we also remember that we, like our forebears, are not perfect. We are real people, far from perfect, but hopefully growing in holiness. So we pray for our deceased loved ones on both days.
