2021 Capital Fund Drive Update

Earlier this year the leadership identified four areas of need and determined a fundraising goal of \$600,000. The four areas of need are:

- To continue to increase the marketability of Kolping Center, The Kolping Pavilion, and Kolping Grove for event rentals
- The general maintenance and repair or replacement of infrastructure, buildings and equipment (Approximately \$300,000).
- To replenish cash reserves due to lack of income in 2020 (Approximately \$150,000)
- To replenish cash reserves due to lack of income in 2021 (Approximately \$150,000)

Since we were blessed with a great SCHÜTZENFEST in 2021 and activities are starting to resume at Kolping, we are reducing our Goal to \$450,000!

Special recognition and deep appreciation goes out to our Schützenfest volunteers, House and Grounds Committee, The Tuesday Workers, The Saturday Workers, and all of the members who have contributed with their finances, time, and efforts!

Our Kolping Family makes a great team and we are looking forward to continuing our work together. We realize that everyone's situation is different, and *any* contribution is *greatly appreciated*!!


