William (Willy) Gerdes, husband of the late Christina (Huentelmann) Gerdes and Kolping member for 56 years, passed away on August 29, 2023 at the age of 92. Willy served on the Cincinnati Kolping Board from 1974-1975, was a member of the Kolping Band and the Schützen Club, and was an advisor for the Kolping 4-H Club. He was also the Schützenfest King from 1971-1972, along with his wife Christina as the Queen, and was a member of the King's Club. We express our sympathies to Willy's children: Rita Garrett, Doris Wilker, Barbara Kopyay, Connie Boggs, Bill Gerdes, Monica Littrell, and Lori Tenhundfeld, along with their families.

Erich Meyer, husband of the late Ursula (Kirbis) Meyer and Kolping member for 59 years, passed away on September 11, 2023 at the age of 96. Erich was the Schützenfest King from 1989-1990, along with his wife Ursula as the Queen, and was a member of the King's Club. Erich also volunteered for many Kolping events and received the Cincinnati Kolping Meritorious Service Award in 2012. We give our condolences to Erich's daughters, Gisela Holstein and Goody P. Kenney, along with the entire Meyer family.

Gary Gerdes, husband of the late Margaret (Mueller) Gerdes and Kolping member for 75 years, passed away on September 20, 2023 at the age of 93. Gary was a fixture at Kolping, serving on the Kolping Board of Directors numerous times, chairing the Kolping Schützenfest and Oktoberfest for two years each, chairing the House & Grounds Committee, chairing the Society's Youth Soccer Program for numerous years, as well as co-founding the Greater Catholic League (GCL) Soccer Banquet in 1975. He also took the first Kolping soccer team to Germany in 1977 and was a soccer coach for many years, being the head of the Sports Club in the 1970s. He became the Schützenfest King in 1954, one of the youngest kings at age 23. He was a member of the Schützen Club, the Tuesday Workers, and the Kolping Golf League. He received the Cincinnati Kolping Meritorious Service Award in 1978 and the National Kolping Distinguished Service Award in 1988. Our condolences go out to Gary's sons, Bernie and Ray Gerdes, as well as their entire family.

Richard Anton, brother of Kolping members Tom and John Anton, passed away on August 22, 2023 at the age of 77. Our sympathies go out to Tom and John, along with their extended families.

This is the event that Care2Share anticipates every year as the pinnacle of our work cycle. Our annual fundraiser is where we get to see all of you, share a meal, and share with you the work that we accomplished in the past year. It is with this joyful heart that we invite you to this event on November 11, 2023. We really look forward to seeing you again.

Our work cycle actually starts and ends with our fundraising event. Then we gear up to make our annual charity mission trip to Vietnam sometime in the spring, typically April when the weather is still nice there. We get to survey the progress of our projects, share a moment in the locals’ daily lives, giving gifts and toys, and sometimes share a meal, whatever they eat. Our main objective is to verify the farming projects with pigs and chicken, among other completed projects, building houses, providing safe drinking water, while sharing our advice, improvement ideas and encouragement. Sunday, October 15, 2:00 P.M.: Participant David Lahrman will lead us in a review of the Austrian nonprofit organization known as *Matricula*. It is under the umbrella of the International Centre for Archival Research – US (ICARUS) and seeks to digitize church records (*matricula is Latin for "register"*). It has a major focus on the vital records kept by the Catholic Church. More than seven million pages of church records are online and growing, and the databases include Catholic Church records from the 1500s to the 1900s. Absentee ballots must be requested in writing per the instructions on page 6. Please note in your request if you would like to receive a copy of the candidates' resumes. The absentee ballots shall be mailed to the address of the absentee voter as indicated, with an inner envelope and a pre-addressed return envelope.

The absentee voter shall complete the ballot, seal it in the inner envelope, and insert into the pre-addressed envelope, mailing directly to the Society. Make sure to have your return name and address on the outside of the pre-addressed envelope. All returned absentee ballots must be received by the Election Committee prior to the election.

The unopened absentee ballots are then opened, verified and counted by the Election Committee after the votes from the general membership are counted on the night of the election.

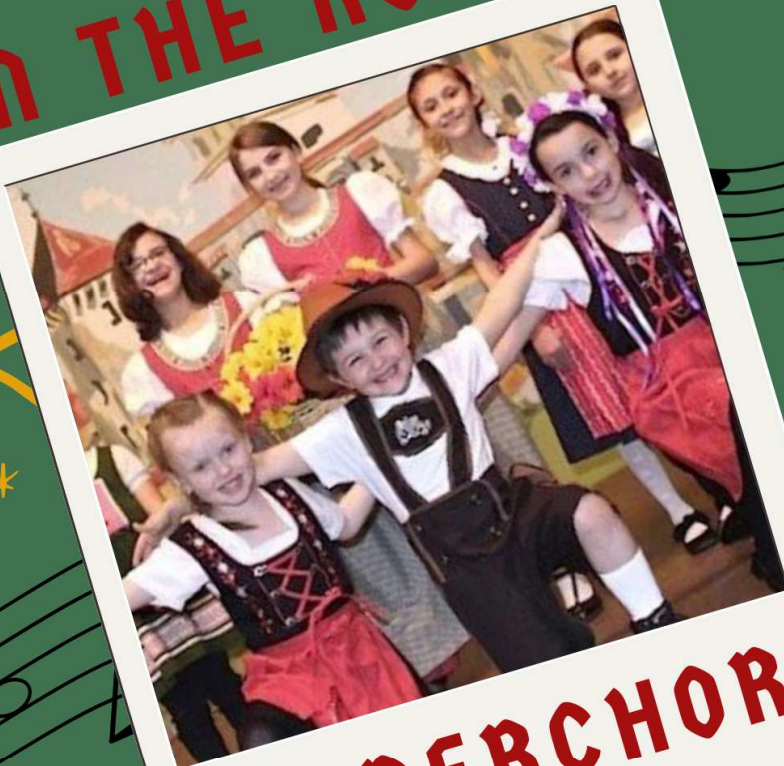
